# EIE MEETING MINUTES

November 1, 2022

*Adopted ~ 2/7/23*

1. **Call to Order:** The meeting was called to order at 4:30 pm.

4. **Approval of Agenda:** Motion to approve agenda was made by Christine Flood and a second by Sandy Papesh. The motion passed unanimously.
5. **Approval of Minutes from October 4, 2022 Meeting:** Motion was made by Kaiya Chamblin to edit the presented draft minutes to reflect spelling error correction of “unedited” to Unaudited and add dollar signs to further clarify. A second was made by Savannah Bueb with no further questions.
6. **Progress Reports:**
  - **Learning Organization-**Director Dumore reported our current enrollment is 149. We have had 3 new enrollments since our last meeting.  
Since our last meeting Michelle Carlson resigned as of October 20, and we were able to hire Kaitlyn Mazzei to teach some of those classes.  
The high school field trip that was rescheduled twice last year finally happened on October 7. Sandy Papesh reported to the group about the activities and student involvement. She shared that according to Andres M., “This was the best field trip lead by science guy, Dennis Mitchell.”  
Director Dumore shared that EIE will continue partnering with Dennis Mitchell for specialty field trips and science enrichment activities.  
Our High School Hangout for October was good at Westside Pizza and then a group trip to College Quest held at Simpson University. Kaiya Chamblin shared her perspective on the variety of college represented and a few take-aways from the event.  
Finally, October 20 was our annual Hawes Pumpkin Patch trip. We had a total of 69 people attend under Angie Olsen’s at Kaitlin Mazzei’s supervision. This was a good turn out for our group and was supported through LCAP Goal #2 engagement and Student Educational Funds.



**7. Discussion/Action Items:**

**A) COVID-**Director Dumore was happy to share things have been quiet in regards to COVID.

**B) Graduation Requirements 2029/2030-**Director Dumore shared the new legislation that requires all high school students to have an ethnic studies semester course. These courses are required to be in place for 2025-2026 school year for the class of 2029-2030. The courses and curriculum recommendations are yet to be determined.

**C) CAASPP 21/22 Results-**Director Dumore shared and reviewed 2021/2022 CAASPP results using our Parsec visuals. In ELA 38.8% of those assessed met or exceeded standard. In Math 10.1% of those assessed met or exceeded standard. Advisory members discussed grade level struggles and strengths as well as needing to drill down on length of enrollment. We did celebrate meeting and exceeding the required 95% participation rate. Discussion was held around the high stakes of not meeting the participation rate and/or students completing the test. Director Dumore also shared the 2018/2019 pre-Covid data: ELA was 35.7% of those assessed measured standard met or exceeded, so EIE had a slight gain recently. In Math, 12.9% of those assessed measured standards met or exceeded with our recent scores being lower.

**D) iReady 21/22 Reflection-**Our local assessment results, iReady, was reported by Director Dumore and shared last year's 21/22 overall results along with the baseline for the start of the school year. The majority of our students enrolled take both ELA and Math. However, there are a few TK/K that are not ready to assess at the start of the year. Additionally, a handful of high school students do not assess because they have tested out. Typically, iReady is geared towards the K-8<sup>th</sup> grade student.

In 21/22 our ELA overall iReady results were 43.9% on or above grade level and 31.6% one grade level below. For Math our overall results were 36% on or above grade level and 40% one grade level below.

Our current baseline for the 22/23 school year is as follows:

ELA Reading results 45.7% on or above grade level and 28.3% one level below.

Math results 25% on or above grade level and 38.3% one level below.

EIE teachers will be working with iReady associates in looking at the data, supports available and how to set goals with students and parents. Director Dumore reported that one professional development day already occurred in October and the final one will be in January. iReady scores are very important because EIE is able to use the results to show student growth and progress. This progress is required by the state for charter renewal. Our staff share with parents and students the importance of our local assessment and encourage them to work towards taking their time to demonstrate progress.
